Municipal taxes

The final tax bill is calculated upon the 2022 returned assessment roll from MPAC (Municipal Property Assessment Corporation) multiplied by the applicable 2022 tax rate. This bill includes two installment due dates of September 30th and November 30th, 2022, with corresponding remittance slips. If you are making branch, telephone, or internet payments for taxes, utilities, etc., please allow for processing time (up to three business days) as payments must be received in the municipal office on or before the due date to avoid penalty charges. When paying your taxes through online banking, use the 15-digit roll number found on your bill without the dashes, decimals, or spaces.

If paying by cheque, please ensure all funds are in Canadian dollars.

Once enrolled, it is your responsibility to notify our office of any changes to your information and to check your email for bills. Hard copies will not be mailed to e-billing subscribers.

If you receive your bills electronically, please consider making payments electronically, too, as the stubs will not have the bar code for quick processing at the office.

Online payments

When paying online, please make sure to use the correct payee. Depending on which bill you are paying, you will have to select either Bluewater Municipality Taxes, Bluewater Municipality PUC or Utilities, or Bluewater Receivables to ensure payment is applied to the correct account. You must allow for processing time when making online payments to ensure they are applied correctly and to avoid extra fees and charges. Utility updates

New water and sewer rates will take effect January 1st, 2023 (By-law 43-2021). You'll see the new rates on your April 2023 bill.

Fall watermain flushing dates will be posted on the municipal website and advertised in local newspapers closer to the date.

If you are renovating and need to temporarily remove the meter reading transmitter box, please notify the utilities clerk. Reconnect transmitters as soon as possible. Flat rate charges will apply if they are not reconnected.

Selling or moving? Please contact the municipal office to schedule a final water meter reading and supply a mailing address for the final bill.

If you have seasonal dwellings that are not heated during the colder months, your water meter needs to be drained. It's your responsibility to protect your meter from frost damage. Water meters may NOT be removed under any circumstances.

Seasonal water shut offs are scheduled on Tuesdays and appointments can be made by contacting the utilities clerk.

Changes coming to Stanley landfill
